Paths for all

Paths for all is helping more people choose to walk, wheel or cycle for everyday journeys.

Paths for all can help grant fund a range of activities that encourage people to change their behaviours to walk or cycle as part of their everyday short journeys. The funding aims to tackle carbon emissions, air pollution and health inequalities. Their Smarter Choices, Smarter Places Open Fund is available to public, third and community sector organisations, as well as private sector organisations partnering with eligible bodies. Local authorities are supported through the Local Authority Fund but can also apply to the Open Fund for additional relevant projects.

Fabb Scotland and West Lothian Bike Library

FABB Scotland is inspiring cycling communities across Scotland through its Blazing Saddles' project, a unique mobile cycling resource that demonstrates how, with a fleet of adaptive cycles, ebikes, standard bikes and motivated people, opportunities to go cycling can be open to all.

Fabb Scotland developed and delivers Blazing Saddles' community engagement programme, a bespoke programme available to a range of organisations and projects that seek to promote partnership working and build a sustainable cycling service. This work has enabled people of all ages and abilities to develop socially and emotionally, building confidence and self-worth, and it has changed lives in varied and positive ways.

West Lothian Bike Library is a community interest company which provides the following services: bike recycling; bike loan and rent; sales and servicing; cycling training; all-ability cycling advice; and, active travel advice and promotion. It evolved from West Lothian Health Improvement Team and FABB working in partnership to deliver regular all-ability cycling programmes which evidenced the need for a more sustainable service within West Lothian.

Sustrans Scotland

Sustrans is the charity making it easier for people to walk and cycle. They are also the custodians of the National Cycle Network.

Places for Everyone is Sustrans' permanent infrastructure fund for Scotland. Sustrans provides funding and expertise to help deliver walking, wheeling and cycling improvements across the country. They currently have more than 200 projects at various stages of development, ranging from multi-million pound transformations in Scotland's cities to new walking routes between some of Scotland's smallest communities.

Places for Everyone funding is available to local authorities, community groups and other organisations to rebalance streets for everyone.

The eBike Grant Fund is available to assist local authorities, public sector agencies, further and higher education institutions, active travel hubs and community groups to adopt ebikes as a sustainable alternative to car journeys. The fund can be used to cover the cost of ebikes, ecargo bikes, cargo bikes and trailers, tandems and adapted cycles.
